

Keep in touch with the IAS Members Only Website

In 2005, the lowa Academy of Science opened our Members' Only Website and made the IAS Membership Directory available to members online rather than in paper form, allowing IAS to contact members through secure email messages and giving members an up to date database. However, the membership database is only as up to date as the information IAS has been provided. Please keep your membership information up to date, especially your email address, only members with a valid email address can access the online database. Having an up to date email address on file will become more important in the following year as IAS investigates the feasibility of online ballots for elections and cost/paper saving changes to our member communications.

How to search the members database and send an email to your fellow section members:

- 1. Log into the IAS Members' Only Website.
- 2. Mouse over the *Directory menu* and click on *Advanced Search*.
- 3. Click on the Search Using Filters link to expand that section of the search tool.
- 4. Scroll down until you can see the list of IAS sections.
- 5. Highlight "Yes" in the selection box for the section you wish to email.
- 6. Scroll to the bottom of the page and click on the Search button. You now have a list of all section members.
- 7. Mouse over the *Directory menu* again and click on *Contact Center*. This will open a web email form.
- 8. Type in the subject and body of the message. Attachments are allowed.
- 9. Click the Continue button.
- 10. Review your message.
- 11. Click on the Send button to send the message.

Emails can be sent to the email address in any completed search. Use the additional features in the filter section of Advanced Search to send an email to the Board of Directors, all the members of a committee or an individual IAS member. Please note that not all IAS members have supplied email addresses and some of the supplied email addresses are not up to date.

Directory Menu Options:

- View entire membership—this option allows you to browse through an alphabetical listing of IAS Members.
- Advanced Search—this option allows many search functions including filtering for all of the members of one
 committee or section. This option also allows custom results, such as returning up to 99 members information per page or creating a list of names by institution.
- My Profile—this option allows you to view your own profile and make certain changes, including hiding your contact information from other members and changing your password.
- **Change Section Membership**—If you complete this form, an email will be sent to the IAS Office Manger requesting that your section assignments be updated to your new selections.
- **Contact Center**—the contact center allows you to send an email to the IAS members in the current search.

If you are looking for just one IAS member's information, type the first or last name into the keyword search on the upper right hand corner of each page. The spelling must match the directory exactly.

Logging In

- Open www.iacad.org.
- Type your username and password into the login fields located on the lower left corner of the page.
- Click Submit.

Your *username* is the email address that you have provided to IAS. Your *password* was mailed to you when you were added to the online database. If you have lost your password, then click on the *Forgot Your Password* button and submit your email address to have your password emailed to you.
