Proposed Dues & Bylaws Changes

IAS Members attending the Annual Meeting in Lamoni will be asked to vote on the following proposals at the Business Meeting.

The Board of Directors is recommending a dues increase to take effect in 2011. The proposed increase will raise annual Professional Membership dues to \$70.00 from the current \$60.00. First year dues for new a member would increase from \$50.00 to \$60.00. Because student memberships are one-half the professional rate their dues would increase to \$35.00. A simple majority is required for approval.

Graceland and Lamoni are Melting Pots of Tradition and Diversity in Southern Iowa

Located in the scenic rolling hills of southern Iowa, two unique communities have enjoyed a mutually rewarding friendship for more than a century. Graceland University was founded in 1895. It is a church-based, liberal arts university that prides itself on great academic programs and a "nurturing"

community" for its 1,000 students. Part of what makes Graceland special is that it sits up on "the Hill," as we say, overlooking the friendly small town of Lamoni.

Lamoni is a town with a feel of the past and yet it is immersed in all that a vibrant, cutting-edge university has to offer. The new, state-of-the-art Resch Science and Technology Hall just opened in the fall of 2009. It offers spacious classrooms and laboratories, industry-standard equipment and top faculty that are attracting science, math and technology students from around the world.

Students from 47 states and 41 countries are on campus this year – 17 percent are international students who add a diversity of culture and ideas to the region. GU offers more than 50 academic majors and programs and a 15:1 student/faculty ratio for a personalized education. Our national-champion Students in Free Enterprise (SIFE) team finished 2nd in the world not long ago, competing against 1,400 university teams. Graceland's sponsoring church is the Community of Christ, based in Independence, Missouri. Our nationally-respected School of Nursing, Seminary and extensive online bachelors and masters offerings in education and nursing are located at our 10-year-old campus in Independence.

Graceland is part of daily life for the 1,500 residents of Lamoni. They enjoy world-class performing arts events, visual arts exhibitions, great collegiate football games, academic lectures and symposiums, national-champion men's and women's soccer matches and the games of 16 other varsity teams that compete in the NAIA. We have a new, artificial-turf football field, great outdoor track facilities, an indoor track and pool, two art galleries, a 750-seat auditorium, wonderful theatre and music programs and an array of other academic and social activities. There is always something exciting to do on "the Hill."

Graceland owns/operates a restored, vintage movie theatre that is shared by the entire region. A beautiful, new Welcome Center on the edge of town (on Interstate 35) is also owned/operated by Graceland. An authentic Amish Country Store at the Welcome Center site opened in 2009, along with an iconic 1950s-style Maid-Rite restaurant. About 50 Amish families have settled around Lamoni in recent years and they have added an old-world charm, enhancing Graceland and Lamoni's uniqueness and friendly atmosphere. Their beautiful Amish quilts, furniture, baskets, baked goods and much more are sold at the Country Store.

Graceland was recently named a "Best in the Midwest" University by the Princeton Review. GU is one of only 158 institutions profiled in the "Best in the Midwest" feature of the 2010 Best Colleges: Region by Region. The 640 colleges across the country named "regional bests" represent only about 25% of the nation's 2,500 four-year colleges.

Perhaps no occasion demonstrates the uniqueness of Graceland and Lamoni more than our annual July 4th Celebration. You see students from Venezuela and Nepal eating corn on the cob alongside Amish farm families and Ph.D. professors in Religion and Chemistry. The fabric store owner and a café proprie-



tor are pitching horseshoes with Theatre students from Kosovo and soccer players from Peru. The volunteer fire chief and the university's president are parked on a shaded bench, swapping stories with a man who farms nearby land his family has owned for 120 years. All is well for Graceland and Lamoni, where "town" and "gown" share Main Street with horse and buggy.
